

# 2018-2019 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Orchestra

It's finally time!! I'm excited to begin 5<sup>th</sup> grade orchestra! Students will have the opportunity to learn to play violin, viola, cello, or bass. Please see below for important details.

1. **What days are classes held?** Ponderosa and Opportunity will meet Mondays and Wednesdays. Chester and Summit will meet Mondays and Fridays. All classes meet at Horizon Middle School. To drop off your child in the mornings, go to the back (north) of the school (turn onto 40<sup>th</sup> Ave and use the parking lot entrance). Students will walk in through the doors by the gym. The orchestra room is just past the band room on the left, room 104.
2. **What time is the class?** Wake up a little early! Classes are from 7:15 to 8:00 AM. The class runs for the entire school year based on the school calendar. I always plan to arrive by 7:10, but with two kids to get ready in the morning, I might be screeching in by 7:15. Thank you, in advance, for your patience! ☺ The outside door opens at 7:00 AM, so feel free to drop your child off at the entrance anytime after that.
3. **When does 5<sup>th</sup> grade orchestra begin?** Orchestra will begin for Ponderosa and Opportunity on Wednesday, Dec. 5 and Chester and Summit on Friday, Dec. 7. Even if students have not had a chance to rent their instruments, still come that first day!
4. **How is my child transported to and from class?** Parents are responsible for transporting their child to Horizon Middle School. A school bus will transport students back to his/her elementary school.
5. **What will my child do when they arrive back at the elementary school so early?** Because we have orchestra before the middle school begins, students do get back to the elementary usually well before school will begin for them. Please have them plan to bring things to do: reading, homework, games, etc. I know that all orchestra students will be able to handle this responsibility of keeping themselves busy and being the best representative of their school.
6. **What kind of instrument can my child play?** You can choose between violin, viola, cello, or bass.
7. **When does your child need to have her/his instrument?** Try to have your instrument rented by the following week of our first meeting. Please talk to me if you have any questions.
8. **Where can I rent an instrument?** There are several good stores to choose from:

*The school district has a very limited number of instruments which are on loan for the year to students with financial need. Please contact me to find out more information.*

9. **What is the cost of renting an instrument?** Depending on the music store, violins rent for about \$25/month, violas about \$25-35/month, cellos about \$50/month, and basses \$70/month.
10. **Should I buy an instrument using the internet?** Unless it's from a company that only sells musical instruments, NO! Very often, internet instruments are not set up for immediate use. They may need strings, a bridge, a good bow or tuners. Sometimes, they are so bad that they can never successfully be played. People often end up spending more money getting a cheap instrument in playing condition. **This includes colored instruments.** Please feel free to contact me with any questions.
11. **What else do I need?** Besides an instrument, all students need to have:
- String Basics, book 1* (Terry Shade and Jeremy Woolstenhulme) for their particular instrument. If you can't find this at the music store you rent your instrument from, it is available on the internet. I have a few copies of the book at Horizon that students may use until they are able to get their own.
  - Rosin (for their bow)
  - A pencil (all musicians need one)
  - Cellos and bass: endpin anchor or stop (should come with the cello)
  - Violins and violas: SHOULDER REST. This is critical for good playing.
12. **Once I get an instrument and book, do I need to do anything before the first day?** Sure! Since we want to make sure instruments are kept safe and things are not lost, please label the case with at least your child's name (a luggage tag works great; if not, duct tape?). Please also have your child put their name in their book. I will also have markers/pens for students to do this in class.
13. **If my child plays cello or bass, can they take it home on the bus?** Unfortunately, no. Bus drivers do not allow the bigger instruments to go on the bus. We have a district employee who is able to take their cello/bass from Horizon MS to their elementary school every orchestra day. It will be up to you and your child to get the instrument home from school.
14. **How much should my child practice a day?** I recommend at least twenty minutes four times a week. I teach how to practice efficiently so that your child will get the most out of the experience.
15. **Will there be concerts?** Absolutely! We will have two concerts this year:  
Thursday, Feb. 7, 7:00 PM, Horizon Middle School  
Thursday, May 23, 7:00 PM, University High School Theatre (with all Horizon orchestras and choirs)
16. **How do I know if my child's instrument is really broken?** Bring the instrument to me. I can fix some things. If not, I will advise you on what to do.
17. **What is the difference between violin and fiddle?** They are the same instrument. Fiddle tunes are different from other violin music.
